Our vision statement:

We aim to create a sustained, lifelong interest in a healthy lifestyle, which includes being active and exercising. We want children to recognize the importance and the mental and physical benefits of regular exercise. We hope to achieve this by providing children with a wide range of sport and activities across the P.E curriculum and through extracurricular clubs.

Sports Premium:

The Government is providing funding next academic year (2024-2025) which will be paid directly to the school for Head Teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all the children. Schools will be expected to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, the school will have the freedom to choose how to do this.
