### **Year 2 Update**


We have had a very busy few weeks in Year 2. The children have been working incredibly hard with reading, writing and Maths and trying their very best to complete the quizzes we are working through at the moment.


In particular, the children enjoyed reading 'The Day the Crayons Quit' by Drew Daywalt. They wrote their own persuasive letters to Blue Crayon to convince him not to quit and got very involved when reading the letters from the crayons!

We have just completed a Science topic learning about Habitats and Microhabitats. The children explored the school field and playground, identifying plants and animals and considering the life processes animals and plants need to show they are alive. We are just beginning a topic all about where our food comes from. The children are learning about dairy farms including why Devon has so many dairy farms.

In Computing, the children have enjoyed creating Art in styles including Pointillism and Impressionism, and focused on the work of Piet Mondrian.

Over the next few weeks the children will be starting to learn to play the ocarina and completing two Design and Technology topics, designing and making their own vehicles and their own salads. We are also excited about our upcoming residential trip to Beaudesert at the end of June.





### Year 1 Update

Our science topic this half term is 'Plants'.

The children have been very busy planting and growing. We started with our amazing strawberry plants that are in the planters by the Key Stage one classrooms. We have been watching them grow each week and observing the flowers. We are very excited that we now have fruit



forming. We are hoping they will ripen soon so we can have strawberries and ice cream before the end of term!



We have learnt about potatoes and the many different ways in which we eat them. The children planted some seed potatoes in the school garden and they are now shooting through the soil so hopefully we will have a good

crop to dig up too. We have also been sowing some marigolds seeds in pots so that the children can bring them home and plant them in their own gardens, keeping our fingers green!

### Year 6 Update

The children have worked really hard over the last half term. In English, they have written fantastic argument texts about whether or not children should be allowed to have mobile phones. The children were really engaged in the session, listened well and asked lots of fantastic questions. In Science, we have been learning about evolution and inheritance. We have talked about how we inherit characteristics from previous generations, how different kinds of twins are created and how different species of animals and plants evolve over time.

We are very proud of how the year 6 children conducted themselves during SATS week. They were calm, sensible, focused and everyone tried their hardest. I am sure that some of the children would even say that they enjoyed the experience. Now that the tests are out of the way, we enjoyed our field trip to Derbyshire and rehearsing for our end of year production. More details will follow soon.

We've worked on 'all things shape' in maths, including angles, co-ordinates, direction and translation. In our History lessons we have been finding out about the reign of the Plantagenets and, in particular, King Richard III. We had a great trip to Bosworth Battlefield on 18th May where we were able to walk in Richard III's footsteps (not literally!).

We finally managed to make our visit to the Leicester Hebrew Synagogue this half term (delayed because of the snow day) and found out lots of interesting things which complimented last half term's learning in R.E. We are now learning about the Christian celebration of Pentecost and are preparing to

lead a whole-school Collective Worship at the end of term to which our parents and carers will be invited. We have managed to fit in so much learning this term, we will certainly be ready for the half term break!
